Managing sustainable and effective cancer civil society organisations.



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Course Description

This course will address areas underpinning the management of civil society organisations, within the context of cancer control, with the aim to support cancer leaders and managers adopt practices that can help their organisations' sustainability and effectiveness.

The course will be particularly valuable for those operating in lower resource settings, without a specialised business background.
