A physicist who is broadly experienced in using computers to identify consistent patterns in the drip paintings of <u>Jackson</u> <u>Pollock</u> has determined that half a dozen small paintings recently discovered and claimed by their owner to be original Pollocks do not exhibit the same patterns.



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One of the works that is claimed to be an original Jackson Pollock. The finding, by Richard P. Taylor, a physics professor at the University of Oregon, does not conclusively prove that Pollock did not paint the works, among a cache of 24 paintings found in 2003 in Wainscott, N.Y. by Alex Matter, whose father, Herbert, and mother. Mercedes, were friends of Pollock's. But it casts serious doubt on their authenticity, even as plans are being made by Mr. Matter for a major exhibition of the paintings later this year. ## (Literary) Stylometry — A thumbnail history

<u>1851</u>: Augustus de Morgan - thought that he might able to distinguish writings (Epistles of St. Paul) via <u>average</u> word length

• <u>1880s</u>: Thomas Mendenhall - tried to use word length <u>distribution</u> to distinguish among Charles Dickens, William Thackeray, John Stuart Mill, as well as among Marlowe, Bacon, and Shakespeare (Shakespeare seemed to use inordinate percentage of <u>4</u>-letter words!)

## (Literary) Stylometry — A thumbnail history (cont.)

• <u>1897</u>: Wincenty Lutoslawski (1863-1954) - uses a mathematical technique to study relative chronology of Plato's Dialogues by considering over 500 different statistics related to word usage, calls the approach "*stylometry*"

- <u>1967</u>: Attribution of the Federalist Papers (Mosteller/Wallace)
  - 77 works ("Publius"): Jay (5), Hamilton (43), Madison (14)
  - Unknown (12), H-M joint (3)
  - Result: WITH HIGH LIKELIHOOD all 12 unknowns due to Madison (Bayesian inference)
- Things took off once computers enter (Project Gutenberg)...
- Applications: Attribution/identification, scholarship, Homeland Security...
- Methods: Many and various...

## Word Frequency

Most techniques work in some manner or another with word frequencies - I.e., the proportion of time a given word is used in an author's writings.

#### Rare words

Favorite words, turns of phrase, idiosyncratic constructs

Eg., Donald Foster and J. Klein's <u>Primary Colors</u>

#### Common words

Function words (express grammatical relationships as opposed to lexical meaning - lexical "glue"):

- prepositions (in, on,..)
- conjunctions (and, or,...)
- pronouns (he, she,...)
- articles (the, that,..)
- participles (if, then,..) -
