

Instructions for Completing OPIc Testing

Your organization determines the location your candidates use to take the OPIc exam. Testing can be done on site (at the hospital, clinic, or other healthcare facility) or at The Language Center at Rutgers University–New Brunswick for an additional fee.

On-Site Testing

For on-site testing, it is recommended that you use a dedicated space that is quiet and in which one or more computers can be set up permanently to accommodate the OPIc exam-takers. For example, a computer lab or conference room would be appropriate. Each computer must have appropriate headphones with a microphone attached to ensure good quality audio delivery and recordings that are clear and audible. The sound of a candidate's voice should not interfere with the performance of others present. Someone from the organization should serve as an on-site administrator/proctor to:

- coordinate with each candidate to schedule their test date/time and to confirm their identity prior to the start of a test session by checking an acceptable organization or government-issued identification;
- be present in the testing room throughout each session, which should be scheduled to last approximately one (1) hour;
- verify with the organization's IT department prior to initiating an OPIc testing program that the testing computers meet the minimal technical requirements; and,
- perform ongoing on-site technical trouble shooting in conjunction with the organization's IT department.
