- Integrate with existing vulture programs, carnivore conservation, and law enforcement

Innovation

- Development of real-time uses of animal telemetry data
- Analysis: MoveApps and EarthRanger collaboration



Scientific Contributions

- African Vulture SAFE
 - 33 publications in first 4 years on population dynamics, threats, movement
 - Bring data from multiple sources to get continent-wide understanding



Lasting Impact



- Identifying areas of decline and poisoning in Tanzania, Zambia, and Zimbabwe
- Tanzania's first action plan for Vultures
- 250+ of rangers and 3000+ of community members understand the threat of poisoning
- 100s of birds rehabilitated and captive-bred Cape Vulture chicks released
- 14 graduate students supported
