Claudia Lozano holds a Bachelor of Science degree in Chemistry and Biology from the Universidad Autonoma de Nuevo Leon and a certification as Registered Environmental Manager. From May 2000 to August 2008, Ms. Lozano worked as Pretreatment Coordinator with the Brownsville Public Utilities Board (BPUB). As Pretreatment Coordinator, Claudia was responsible for the administration, development, and implementation of the BPUB's Pretreatment Industrial Program as required by federal, state and local regulations.

In September 2008 she joined the TCEQ, where she serves as the Border Affairs Lead Border Team Coordinator in the Harlingen Regional Office, overseeing the Laredo and El Paso Border Affairs activities. Coordinates the development and implementation of border-related activities in the area from Falcon Dam to the Gulf of Mexico, with the regional office, the Austin headquarters of the TCEQ, other state agencies, the Mexican state and local governments, U.S. federal entities, international agencies, NAFTA-related institutions, and other stakeholders in the border region.
