Consistent presence on campus – more than a fall recruiting effort

- ❖ Find majors where students have the skillsets that will help them succeed in the actuarial career – math, economics, science, some engineering disciplines
- Find professors who will be open to and advocate for career choices aside from graduate school
- Adjust presentations for the audience students are likely just finding out about the actuarial career, and are unfamiliar with the exam process
- The consistency of your campus presence over time will make a difference!

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



Example discussion topics (Ratemaking):

- ❖ You are a pricing actuary responsible for setting rates for automobile insurance. You receive a bulletin from a state Department of Insurance requesting information on how the effects of rising gas prices are reflected in your company's Auto rates. How would you respond?
- How might texting while driving impact auto insurance prices?
- How are new auto safety features impacting claim frequency? Claim severity?
- Smart home sensors are becoming more prevalent. How might you evaluate whether customers with these sensors should receive a discount on their homeowners insurance?

University Liaison Role and Expectations



Be enthusiastic about the CAS as the top choice for students

- Majority of students might not realize the distinction between the CAS and the SOA
- When focusing on building awareness of the profession, crossfunctional actuarial panels have worked well to introduce students to the wide variety of actuarial work
 - All members of the panel are alumni
 - Some work in consulting, others for insurance companies
 - Major areas of actuarial work include predictive modeling, ratemaking, reserving, health insurance, and life/annuities

CAS Trust Scholarship Program casact.org/trustscholarship

CAS Strategic Plan: Basic Education

"Future CAS members will be provided with a basic education system that reflects contemporary and relevant analytical techniques utilizing new technologies for delivery and validation."

- Deliver quality basic education that integrates skills
- Review and refresh syllabus content
- Transform content delivery and validation methods

Deliver Quality Basic Education that Integrates Skills

- CAS Course on Professionalism expanded to include Communication Skills
 - Expanded from 1 ½ days to 2 days
 - Pre-work to introduce effective communication skills
 - Application of communication skills in small group environment
 - Beginning with the August, 2019 Course
 - COP now offered four times per year

Current CAS Syllabus to Reach ACAS

- Validation by Educational Experience (VEE):
 - VEE-Accounting and Corporate Finance
 - VEE-Economics
- Two CAS Online Courses:
 - Online Course 1—Risk Management and Ins Operations

Current CAS Syllabus to Reach FCAS

ACAS plus:

- Exam 7—Estimation of Policy Liabilities, Insurance Company Valuation, and Enterprise Risk Management
- Exam 8—Advanced Ratemaking
- Exam 9—Financial Risk and Rate of Return

Review and refresh syllabus content

- Modern Actuarial Statistics I and II (MAS-I and MAS-II) were added to the syllabus in 2018
 - 4-hour paper-and-pencil multiple choice exams offered every six months
 - Replace former Exam S and Exam 4 (SOA Exam C)
 - Address the emerging needs of future actuaries and their employers
 - Increase the relevance of the CAS exam syllabus with respect to emerging statistical and analytical skills
 - In the future, Fellowship exams will be updated to incorporate these techniques learned in earlier exams

Modern Actuarial Statistics I (MAS-I)

Similar to Exam S, but with more emphasis on applied modeling and a deeper coverage of generalized linear models

Topics Covered:

- Probability Models (Stochastic Processes and Survival Models)
- Statistics
- Extended Linear Models
- Time Series with Constant Variance

Modern Actuarial Statistics II (MAS-II)

Covers several topics from the former Exam 4, along with new statistics and predictive analytics material

Topics Covered:

- Introduction to Credibility
- Linear Mixed Models
- Bayesian Analysis and Markov Chain Monte Carlo
- Statistical Learning

Transform Delivery & Validation Methods

- Introduced Integrative Questions (IQ's) on Fellowship Exams (Exams 7, 8, and 9) starting in 2017
 - Larger questions, typically worth 10-15% of the exam points
 - Can synthesize material across multiple learning objectives
 - Expect to increase the number of IQ's over time
- Technology-based Exams (TBE) Initiative
 - Excel-based exams offered for Exam 5 in Spring 2018
 - Lessons learned from first pilot
 - Additional work needed on logistics of TBE exams
 - Future TBE deferred at this time

Basic Education Summary

- Syllabus is constantly being adapted and refreshed
- Curriculum reflects experience of practicing actuaries who understand what is required to practice in the casualty actuarial field
- Most robust and comprehensive framework for training P&C actuaries
- Proven commodity and highly-valued around the world by employers and other stakeholders
- Adaptive to meet the *future needs* of employers and other stakeholders

Advice to Students

Common question: Do the CAS and SOA exam structures require students to decide earlier which exam path to take?

Maybe, but keep in mind:

- Few students take more than three exams while in school
- Students also do internships, projects, job-shadowing
- Each society is responding to different needs of different stakeholders
- Not necessarily in the long-term best interest of students to emphasize exams over other experiences (internships, projects, leadership, etc.)
