Physician Assistants Certified by NCCPA: all U.S. states, the District of Columbia and the U.S. territories rely on NCCPA certification as one of the criteria for initial licensure or regulation of physician assistants. As of Dec. 31, 2019, there were more than 139,000 certified PAs.

Certification & Programs:

<u>Physician Assistant National Certifying Examination(PANCE)</u> – initial certification exam.

<u>Continuing Medical Education (CME)</u> – required every two years during a ten-year certification maintenance cycle.

<u>Physician Assistant National Recertifying Examination (PANRE)</u> – exam required during the ninth or tenth year of the PA certification maintenance cycle.

<u>Specialty Certificates of Added Qualifications (CAQs)</u> – credentials to effectively document specialty experience and expertise. Available CAQs include:

- Cardiovascular and Thoracic Surgery CAQ
- Emergency Medicine CAQ
- Hospital Medicine
- Nephrology CAQ
- Orthopaedic Surgery CAQ
- Pediatrics
- Psychiatry CAQ

<u>Research</u> - NCCPA has a robust repository of data on certified PA demographic and practice characteristics, and the organization is grateful to the certified PAs who take the time and effort to provide this data.
