Need to Teach the Telemedicine Exam

- *Strategies*
 - *Didactic Sessions*
 - *Attending Evaluations with Real patients*
 - *Attending as Patient*
 - *Fellow –Fellow Education (Clinician/Patient)*
 - *Guess the Diagnosis*
 - *Mock Patient*

Need to Evaluate How we Teach the Telemedicine Exam

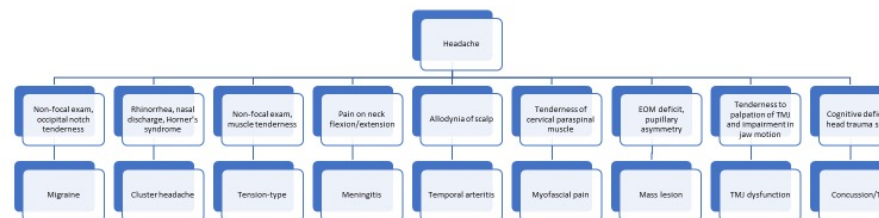
- **Take Home Lessons**

- Shorter encounters are ideal for training purposes
- Standardization in clinical diagnoses and requirements should be instituted to ensure uniformity in training
- Relevant props should be provided prior to mock encounters
- Session can be recorded and observed in real-time by an attending but attending should ensure recording is possible using particular software and should have video off and mic muted during the session
- Immediate as opposed to delayed feedback is preferred.
- Training protocols should be designed to help fellows identify when and when not to perform an extensive virtual physical examination.

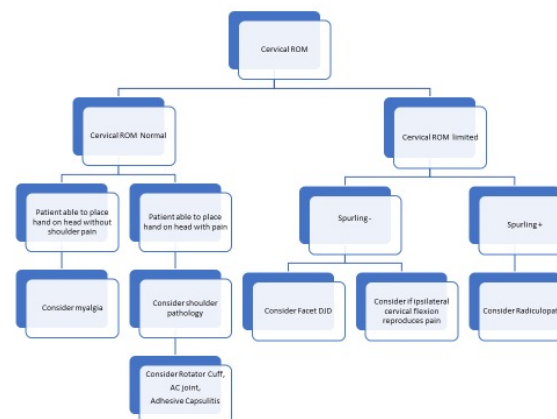

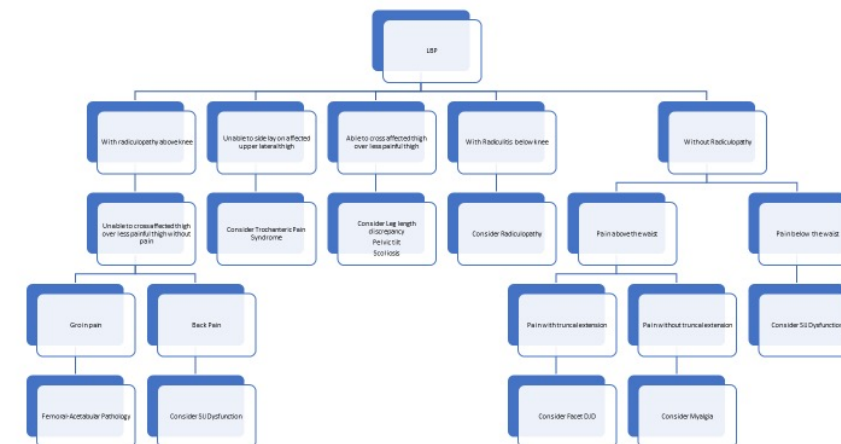
Headache Telemedicine Algorithm
