How does it work?

The accredited CME provider enters data about an upcoming activity in PARS.




Licensees participate in CME activities and provide their licensee number and/or NPI.



The accredited CME provider confirms the licensee has satisfactorily completed the activity.



The accredited CME provider reports the completion data into PARS.



The board can review the completion data in PARS.

What are the program goals?

- Provide a unified system for all state medical boards to use for verifying the CME participation for their licensees.
- Simplify the boards' review of licensees for meeting periodic re-licensing requirements.
- Assure boards that the CME credits reported for physicians are primary-source verified.
- Reduce the reporting burden for physicians.

What are the benefits?

- The data are primary-source verified.
- There is no cost to participate in this program to the state medical boards, the physicians or the CME providers.
- Accredited CME providers are already required to use ACCME's Program and Activity Reporting System (PARS) to enter information about their CME activities.
- CME providers enter verified participation information about your physician licensees into PARS throughout the year.
- No IT development for boards! You simply log into PARS using your web browser and search/view/download CME earned by licensees instead of collecting and reviewing paper or electronic CME certificates.

Starting in 2021, ACCME will be opening up the State Medical Board Pilot to any board under the Federation of State Medical Boards.
