Madelaine A. Feldman, MD, FACR

Dr. Madelaine Feldman is a rheumatologist in private practice with The Rheumatology Group in New Orleans, LA. She is President of the Coalition of State Rheumatology Organizations, Chair of the Alliance for Safe Biologic Medicines and past member of the American College of Rheumatology insurance subcommittee.

Dr. Feldman is a Clinical Assistant Professor of Medicine at Tulane University School of Medicine, and lectures extensively to patients, physicians, regulators, and legislators both locally and nationally,

speaking before the Health subcommittee of Energy and Commerce in 2019. She has spoken and written on the drug supply channel, particularly the effect that formulary construction and utilization management tools have on pricing and access to drugs (availability & affordability).

Dr. Feldman received the Distinguished Service Award for Tulane Medical School, was named one of the Top Women in New Orleans by City Business in 2017 and is the former radio talk show host of "Driving with Dr. Mattie."



Herbert S. B. Baraf, MD, FACP, MACR

Dr. Baraf is founding member and former managing partner of Arthritis and Rheumatism Associates (ARA), one of the largest private rheumatology practices in the United States with 23 rheumatologists in seven locations. He holds academic appointments as Clinical Professor of Medicine at George Washington University in Washington, DC, and Associate Clinical Professor at the University of Maryland in Baltimore.

He earned his medical degree from the State University of New York Downstate Medical Center in Brooklyn, New York, and completed his

internship and residency at the George Washington University Hospital. Dr. Baraf did his fellowship training in rheumatology at Duke University in Durham, North Carolina.

Dr. Baraf has served on numerous committees of the American College of Rheumatology (ACR), contributing to programming for its annual meeting, helping to develop quality of care measures and, more recently, lobbying Congress for more rational payment systems for patient care. His efforts were instrumental in the ACR's development of freestanding musculoskeletal ultrasound courses for rheumatologists.

As the founder of the Center for Rheumatology and Bone Research, a division of his practice, Dr. Baraf has served as principal investigator on over 400 clinical trials of treatments for gout,

rheumatoid arthritis, psoriatic arthritis, Sjögren's syndrome, and other disorders. He formerly served on the board of directors of the Sjögren's Foundation.

He is an author of more than 30 peer-reviewed papers and has presented his work at numerous national and international meetings. Dr. Baraf was named a Master of the ACR in 2012. In 2014 the ACR conferred upon him the Paulding Phelps Award for "for outstanding service to patients, community and the practice of medicine."



Steve McCoy, Esq.

Mr. McCoy is a graduate of the University of Virginia and the University of Virginia School of Law. He spent 11 years in private practice as a partner in the health law section of Williams Mullen, in Richmond, Virginia, where he represented physicians, hospitals and other health care providers.

He left Williams Mullen to serve as general counsel to Patient First Corporation, a provider of primary and urgent care services that employs over 600 physicians and extenders at 76 locations across the mid-

Atlantic, and treats patients during more than 3 million visits annually.

Mr. McCoy is the past chair of the Health Law Section of the Virginia State Bar and is currently a member of the Board of Governors of the Virginia Bar Association's Health Law Council.



James M. Dahle, MD

James M. Dahle, MD, is a practicing emergency physician and veteran from Salt Lake City, UT. He became interested in personal finance and investing after becoming disillusioned with the way he was treated by several unscrupulous financial professionals.

In an effort to help his fellow physicians and other high-income professionals avoid the same errors, he started The White Coat Investor website in 2011. It rapidly grew into the most widely-read,

physician-specific personal finance and investing website in the world. He has written three Amazon best-selling books, publishes a weekly podcast, developed multiple online courses, and holds an annual conference all aimed at helping his fellow physicians become more financially literate.

Dr. Schweitz completed a seven year undergraduate and medical school program at the George Washington University in Washington, DC, in 1972. He completed his internal medicine training at GW and his rheumatology fellowship at Georgetown University in 1977. He then entered private practice in West Palm Beach, Florida.

Dr. Schweitz is a partner in Arthritis and Rheumatology Associates of Palm Beach, a seven physician single specialty practice in Palm Beach County. He is a Fellow of the American College of Physicians and Master of the

American College of Rheumatology. He served as a member of the Committee on Rheumatologic Care. He is a past president of CSRO and the Florida Society of Rheumatology where he continues to sit on both executive committees.

He has served on the Board of Directors of the Arthritis Foundation at both state and local levels for many years and for the past 40 years has donated his time in helping to staff a free arthritis clinic for medically indigent patients in Palm Beach County. Dr. Schweitz has been recognized in "Best Doctors of South Florida" and "America's Top Physicians."
