GUILTY! GUILTY! GUILTY!

Setback for Zuma as Shaik loses all appeals

If the Supreme Court of Appeal (SCA) finds that Judge Squire's ruling on Shaik's appeal is correct, it will be an old man before he gets out of jail.

The Bloemfontein court this morning unanimously rejected every one of Shaik's attempts to appeal his final and two corruption convictions and sentences.

Not only did the five judges unanimously find that Shaik's grounds for appeal were without merit, but they also ruled that his corrupt relationship with former deputy president Jacob Zuma went against the very fibres of the Constitution.

Shaik heard the news with a heavy heart today.

"I can't believe it," he said. "From 12pm to 1.30. They didn't spend anything. All the lawyers were wrong about what was going to happen."

What was extremely worrying to him was the court's denial of any appeal on his corruptly corrupt relationship with Zuma, which it found difficult to disprove.

Shaik immediately

demanded that his conviction be set aside, with its petrifying effects, to bail out.

Previously the most controversial of Judge Squire's rulings on Shaik's final and corruption trial was his decision to admit the notorious 'unencrypted fax' intervention for Court 3 - and then use the document to find that Shaik had bribed a R200 000 bribe for Zuma from French arms company Thales.

The court's difficulty in admitting the fax revolved around the so-called "American" provisions to the Criminal Procedure Act and on the fact that neither Thales representative Ahsan Thahar nor Zuma were ever cross-examined about it.

In deciding to uphold Judge Squire's admissibility ruling on the fax, Squire initially expressed certain reservations. The SCA has effectively kept both Zuma and Thales on the hook.

Should the state elect to sue the fax in any future prosecution of Thales or Zuma, however, it will probably elect to present its evidence around the document very carefully - for trial rights
